School-linked Oral Health Program

School-linked dental screenings are back in schools! During the 2022–2023 school year, the LOHP and Community Medical Centers (CMC) were able to provide oral health screenings, fluoride varnish, sealants, and education in three local school districts.



Altogether, almost <u>600</u> children were screened and received education about oral health with interactive books and demonstrations. Staff engaged students using a fun educational presentation with Stella and learned about proper brushing techniques, how healthy foods are good for your teeth, and the importance of seeing their dentist.

Children also read fun, interactive oral health books along with detailed pictures of different good and bad oral health conditions.

After the presentation, children better understood the importance to maintaining their good oral health by brushing and flossing regularly. Children were given a take home toothbrush kit after receiving services to continue those habits at home.



CMC and the LOHP have begun scheduling school screenings for the school-linked dental program during the 2023-2024 school year. The program looks forward to providing dental screenings and education for children throughout the county.

Stella Wins A Gold Addy Award!

SJTEETH is excited to announce that Stella's Shiny Smile Activity Kit received the 2023 Gold Addy in Sacramento back in March!



As part of the "Stella's Shiny Smile" campaign launched in 2020, this activity kit was produced by Runyon Saltzman (RSE), First 5 San Joaquin, and Public Health Services to further teach young children about the importance of good dental health and how to properly brush their teeth. In this activity kit, Stella comes to life as a puppet. She interacts with children as the storybook is read and plays the "Good Things Come in 2s!" memory game. A smaller leave-behind kit helps put the education into practice. It includes the "Stella's Shiny Smile" storybook, an adorable Stella finger puppet, and mirror cling reminding children to brush their teeth for two minutes, two times a day. "Lessons in a Lunchbox" is Back!

Dr. Winifred Booker is a pediatric dentist based in Maryland. In 2008, she founded "Lessons in a Lunch Box: Healthy Teeth Essentials & Facts About Snacks,®" an oral health literacy program aimed to provide children and their families with education about routine dental care, oral health hygiene, good dietary choices and more using a "dentally designed" lunch box. The program is one of the many initiatives under The Children's Oral Health Institute (COHI), a 501(c)3 organization created to combat dental neglect and oral abuse among children.

The goal of COHI is to improve the attitudes and behavior of children and families on a variety of oral health issues through early health promotion and disease prevention education. The Lessons in a Lunchbox Program was put on pause in 2020, likely in response to the pandemic.

The Lessons in a Lunchbox Program has delivered over 65,000 lunchboxes and has been presented in all 50 states. Additionally, retailers Crest + Oral B have featured their free course "Improving Oral Health Literacy: **Teaching Primary School Students** through the Lessons in a Lunch Box **Program**" as a Continuing Education Credit. Though the course aims toward dental professionals, any health professional can take the course to learn about proper oral hygiene and to introduce the program to students. A certificate is awarded upon completion.

Fluoride Varnish Training Program

According to the <u>Association of State & Territorial Dental Directors</u> (<u>ASTDD</u>), school nurses can play an essential role in identifying children in need of dental care. In August, Public Health Services LOHP staff established an Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with schools that allows school nurses to apply fluoride varnish in the school setting.

The first fluoride varnish training occurred in September at the San Joaquin County Office of Education during the quarterly School Nurse Administrators meeting. The training was provided by LOHP staff in partnership with Health Plan of San Joaquin and their subcontracted registered dental hygienist, Irene Alvarez.

The training was successful, with a total of 12 nurses participating. Six nurses returned evaluations with overall positive feedback and planned to implement the program in their schools. Trained nurses are required to track and report fluoride varnish applications in the Healthy Futures database and data will be used to measure the program's impact.
